## ABOUT GLODEP

Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree in International Development Studies (GLODEP) is a two-year multidisciplinary program that links the areas of development studies and development economics. The program provides the students with knowledge and skills to analyze development issues and to design and promote development policies at national, regional, and international levels.

### The overarching themes of the program are:

- development goals and policies
- socio-economic development
- poverty, food security, and inequality
- geography and environment

The program has a fixed structure: students spend the first three semesters at three consortium universities; the fourth semester is dedicated to internship or research stay and to thesis writing.

## CAREER

GLODEP enables the graduates to work in higher-level positions (such as policy officers and program managers) in governmental, non-governmental, and international organizations as well as in businesses; with a focus on sustainable economic and human development. The graduates will be fit to work in teams of people from diverse disciplinary backgrounds.



## ADMISSIONS

GLODEP is open for candidates with an undergraduate degree in areas relevant for the program, such as development studies, economics, geography, and international relations. The program seeks candidates with excellent academic results, strong interest in international development, and proficiency in English.

The call for applications is open from October/November to January/February (for exact dates see the website).

## FEES AND FUNDING

### Participation Costs

9 000 EUR per year for Partner Countries students, 4 500 EUR per year for Programme Country students (include tuition fees, administrative costs, and insurance)

### Scholarships

The program offers about 20 full EMJMD scholarships covering the participation costs (paid to the Consortium) as well as contribution to travel, installation, and subsistence costs (paid to student scholarship holders). These scholarships are funded by the European Union.

### Self-funded students

Self-funded students are offered reduced participation costs of 3 000 EUR per year which cover the tuition fees. Administrative fees and insurance are not covered.

The Associates were selected in order to provide students with knowledge and experience related to the respective regions and countries of the associates. In the fourth semester Academic Associates host several students during their research stay and help with co-supervision of their theses. Non-Academic Associates may provide internship placements in the fourth semester and contribute to curricula with workshops and presentations.
